An Interfaith Bible Study with Temple Beth Shalom

On the last Saturday morning in May (right now we're thinking 11:30 will be a good time), Temple Beth Shalom and St. John's will begin a monthly Bible Study led by Rabbi Neil Amswych and Pastor Matt Bridges that will cover a variety of sacred texts and topics. We will celebrate our traditions, our communities, and grow together in faith from perspectives that we don't always encounter. Our first faithful conversation will be on the topic of creation from a Jewish and Christian perspective. Please let Pastor Matt know if you are interested.

<u>Upcoming Series:</u> Believing Into Christ

In the Sundays after Easter and taking us to Pentecost, we will explore themes from Revelation and the Gospel of John about what is possible when we believe. Belief is not only an intellectual endeavor and assent to the power of God to transform, but also a process that helps us use our hands and feet in ways similar to how Jesus used his hands and feet to seek out and address the hurting ones, including our planet and its most vulnerable people and beyond-human creatures.

Week 1: Embodied Believing: Our beliefs connect us to Christ, in whom we believe and into whom we grow, by embodying the assents we make.

Week 2: Circling Toward Food Justice: Food justice is a recognition that not everyone has access to the same kinds of nutritious foods that are available in some places, depending on geography, infrastructure, and economics. Unjust systems are in place. Part of our call as Christians is to interrupt those unjust systems and provide for all.

Week 3: Springs of Living Water: An old song, "Spring, up O Well!" reminds us that the river of life flows into us and out of us into the world. We celebrate the living water nourishing us and the world when we share it with those around us. Week 4: A New World: God is creating a new world out of this one. God is making all things possible, starting here and now. God is renewing life, love, and connection for the benefit of what is and will be for this world.

Week 5: The Tree of Life: The imagery of trees is centered in this week's texts and our worship experience because trees are sources of life. They provide oxygen we breathe, food that nourishes us, and shade that protects us.

Week 6: Becoming One: On this final week in the series, we recognize how interdependent we are with creation, and we celebrate that when we benefit, we also benefit others.
